General School Information

Overview

KIPP Columbus will open the school year remotely for the first 6 weeks (August 24-October 2). This decision was not made lightly, and a decision will be made concerning "KIPP on Campus" no later than September 18th. Additionally, some families may opt into KIPP at Home for the entire first semester of the school year. The information below outlines specific details for any time students are working remotely this school year.

School Year Launch

We are launching our 2020-21 school year remotely.

- 'KIPP On Campus' Option: Remote, virtual only learning from August 24, 2020 to October 2, 2020.
- 'KIPP At Home' Option: Will remain in the virtual learning environment through December.

Remote Learning Hours

Our remote learning hours are 9 AM - 3:30 PM, Monday - Friday for ALL students.

Family Communication

The primary tool that will be used to support daily communication for all K-12 families will be [ClassDojo](#). Families can use this app to message teachers and get updates on what is happening in the school community.

Schools will be distributing codes to families for how to access their KIPPsters ClassDojo account. More information on how to setup and access ClassDojo can be found [here](#).

Meal Pick-Up Weekly

KIPP Columbus will distribute meals to families from 9am-12p and 4pm-6pm every Tuesday. Families are encouraged to come to KIPP and pick up 7 breakfasts and 7 lunches per child in their home.

Attendance Overview

Students will be counted as present by engaging with Google Classroom. So long as a student logs into their Google Classroom and interacts with posted assignments they will be counted as present for that day.

For more information regarding attendance in the remote environment, please review the 'Attendance' section of this document.

Daily Advisory

Each school will have a daily morning advisory/morning meeting for at least 15 minutes every school day. This is a space for students to check-in with their teacher/KIPP staff member, ask questions and get general information on upcoming events and build community with one another.

Learning Platforms

We want to simplify how many tools and learning platforms students interact with on a daily basis. To keep things simple, the primary tools that a student/family needs to know in order to be able to engage in remote learning are:

1. **GoogleClassroom:** Where all of a KIPPsters work will be posted and links to their blended learning programs.
2. **Zoom:** How a student will access their synchronous (real-time) instruction.
3. **ClassDojo:** How all families across K-12 will stay informed about what is happening at their KIPPsters' school and be able to communicate directly with teachers.

KIPP Columbus will be releasing tutorial videos for families on how to access these three platforms before the launch of school on our website at KIPPColumbus.org.

Engaging with Remote Learning

How to Log into a Chromebook

All student work during the remote learning period can be accessed via the internet using a KIPP Columbus provided Chromebook. To log into a Chromebook KIPPsters need to:

- Power up the chromebook with the power icon in the right hand corner of the chromebook
- Enter your KIPP Columbus provided Google Account username into the Username field
- Enter your KIPP Columbus provided Google Account password into the password field
- Click Login
- Select your profile picture
- Click OK


How to Access Student Work and Classes

To access a KIPPsters work, they need to log into GoogleClassroom. To access GoogleClassroom your student can simply click the Google Classroom icon on their chromebook or go to <https://classroom.google.com>



Sign In via the KIPP Columbus provided Google Account information.

Your KIPPster will then be logged into their GoogleClassroom where they will be able to see all of the classes that they are enrolled in.



KIPPsters choose the class that they want to access by clicking the title of the class.

All student work including access to blended learning programs, synchronous (real-time) classes via Zoom links can be accessed through GoogleClassroom.

Accessing Blended Learning Programs

We are excited to be able to offer students blended learning opportunities that complement the instruction they receive in their virtual classroom. Blended learning programs are self-paced virtual learning programs that adapt and adjust to how students learn.

Each school uses different blended learning programs:

- K-5
 - Lexia: Reading program
 - Zearn: Math program
 - Accelerated Reader: Supplemental reading program used in 5th grade
- 6-8
 - IXL: Reading, Science, Social Studies and math program
- High School
 - Winward: ACT preparatory blended learning program for 10th and 11th grade.

To access these programs a student will sign-in through Clever. To access, Clever, a student simply needs to sign-in using their Google account.

Engaging in Synchronous (Real-Time) Classes

During every school day, students will be expected to login to their classes at specific times for synchronous (real-time) instruction. Your child's teachers will be in contact with you regarding your school's daily schedule.

All synchronous (real-time) instruction will be delivered through Zoom. The links to the Zoom classes will be posted in your child's GoogleClassroom account.

KIPPsters are expected to keep their cameras on and be fully engaged and present during live classes.

Homework Help

We are excited to share that in addition to your child's teacher and KIPP staff being available for support, families and students can reach out to the Columbus Metropolitan Library (CML) which is offering a dedicated homework help line for students/families.

Acceptable Use of Technology

On and off campus student use of the computers at KIPP Columbus is a privilege.

KIPP Columbus students must agree that they will not participate in any of the following activities when using KIPP Columbus computers:

- Sending or displaying offensive pictures, using obscene language, or harassing, insulting, threatening or abusing other network users;
- Any activity that encourages the use of drugs, alcohol or tobacco, or that promotes any activity prohibited by law or KIPP policy;
- Posting, sending or displaying any personal identification information of anyone under 18;
- Using the Internet for financial gain;
- Damaging or disrupting equipment, software or system performance;
- Using others' passwords or accounts;
- Posting anonymous messages or messages with a false identity;
- Trespassing in or deleting files, info, or data that does not belong to you;
- Downloading or printing files or messages that are profane, obscene, or that use language that offends others;
- Playing unauthorized games;
- Computer piracy, hacking, or any tampering with hardware or software;
- Using the Internet for any illegal activity, including violation of copyright or other laws;

- Activities that allow a computer or network to become infected with a virus or other destructive influence.

KIPP Columbus will educate all students about appropriate virtual behavior, including how to interact with other individuals on social networking websites and in chat rooms, and about cyberbullying awareness and response. Violating this policy could result in loss of a student's online, Internet, and/or computing device privileges, or could result in other disciplinary actions based on the situation and circumstances.

Computer Monitoring

All KIPP Columbus computers are considered school property and they are monitored through a software called GoGuardian. GoGuardian monitors the internet and virtual activity of students and sends notifications for any inappropriate content that a student may access on their school computer.

Remote Behavior Expectations

For students struggling with behavior expectations in remote classes, teachers will follow the tiered approach below to get support for the student.

- Redirect the student and use the tools of the virtual classroom (private chat, muting, breakout room, etc.) to have a restorative conversation and re-engage the KIPPster.
- If the behavior is so disruptive that instruction cannot continue, the KIPPster can be removed from the virtual classroom.
 - If a KIPPster is removed from the virtual classroom, the teacher will follow up with the family as soon as is feasible that same day to check in and facilitate the restorative conversation with the KIPPster.
- If the student is disruptive to the point of a removal from the virtual classroom **multiple** times in a week, please contact the Dean of Student Life for them to reach out and support that KIPPster.

Internet Safety

Your student now has 24-hour access to the internet, and we want to make sure that your child stays safe with this resource. Below are some recommended tips and helpful resources:

- Use Internet devices in a central location at home, rather than behind closed doors.
- Ensure that your child understands that he or she should not give personal information to any person or any website without checking with an adult first.
- Talk with your child about cyberbullying encouraging them to be kind and to communicate clearly online.

Attendance

We want our KIPPsters to engage in learning every day. If we can be supportive to families/students at any time, please do not hesitate to reach out. The health and safety of everyone in our KIPP community remains our top priority, and we appreciate you staying in contact with us regarding your child's engagement in school.

Attendance During Remote Learning

ALL Schools:

- Daily attendance will be taken by a student interacting with material that has been assigned on a KIPPster's GoogleClassroom.
- Students are expected to access their synchronous (real-time) classes on the assigned day and complete their asynchronous (self-paced) work on the assigned day.

Reporting a Child's Illness for remote learning

Grading Policy

At KIPP Columbus, we strive to create excellent and equitable experiences for our students and families across schools. This grading policy is meant to ensure that there is transparency concerning the key elements of our shared academic expectations.

K-5 Academic Grading Policy

Gradebook Categories

We want it to be easy to understand how and why a student earns the grades that they do at KIPP Columbus.

Students' grades are composed of two categories: Work Habits and Mastery. These categories will allow students to get credit for and be held accountable to both synchronous (real-time) and asynchronous (self-paced) learning that occurs during the remote learning period and be able to translate to in-person learning as well.

Category	Description
WORK HABITS (EFFORT)	This is a measure of the student's work ethic and effort outside of the classroom. This includes but is not limited to: exit tickets, blended learning assignments, test corrections, etc. Students will be graded in this category for completion, however teachers can still provide students with feedback on the accuracy of their work.
MASTERY (ACHIEVEMENT)	This serves as a snapshot of students' mastery of the content. The mastery of each major grade level skill will be reported out, based on their standards performance on formative and summatives. Students will be graded in this category for accuracy.

Student Grades

In Kindergarten through 5th grade, students earn "Performance Bands" as grades. Rather than a traditional letter grade system, this helps our students and families focus on the growth that they can continue to make rather than feeling evaluated or judged.

Performance Bands (PBs)	PB Score Ranges
Far Below Target	50-59%
Below Target	60-69%
Approaching Target	70-79%

Completion Grading vs. Mastery Grading

Completion assignments are those that students should receive credit for completing with their best effort. Assignments that fall into the Work Habits buckets will be graded for completion. This includes blended learning, exit tickets, asynchronous (self-paced) learning assignments. Mastery assignments should be graded for proficiency and accuracy. This includes formative and summative assessments.

Due Dates, Deadlines, and Missing Work

Students are expected to submit work on time, frequently with few exceptions made. Students are more likely to complete high quality work and be at or above target in each course if they complete assignments to the best of their ability, and on time. Teachers will communicate out a due date for each assignment and students are expected to work hard to complete the assignment before that time and ask for help when they need it. If a student misses this due date, they will have the opportunity to submit the missing work.

Exempt Assignments

If a student is absent for more than five school days, teachers may choose to exempt a student from assignments. For this to occur, a student and their family must communicate and partner with the teacher to create a plan that makes the most sense for the student. There should be documentation (doctor's note, etc) that clearly outlines the compelling reason that a student missed that much school. This could include reasons related to coronavirus.

It is important to note that students will never be exempt for assessments or the knowledge and skills they should be acquiring over the course of the school year.

Assessments & Retakes

Learning depends on mistakes, but only when there's a way to review mistakes and an opportunity to correct them. Teachers will create opportunities for a student to show improved performance by allowing students to retake assessments on which they score below 70%. Students will be required to attend a minimum of one intervention/reteach session before retaking the assessment. The higher of the two grades will be the one that is entered into the gradebook.

Report Card Overview

On a report card, families will get a Work Habits grade for each subject (Reading & Writing, math) per semester. This will help families know specifically which subjects their student needs more support in and how to leverage the subjects they are excelling in.

For mastery, we want to communicate clearly the grade-level skills that students are on target for, and which need improvement, rather than give one grade for an assessment or subject. The standards-level data from both formative and summative assessments will be used to roll up to a grade for each skill.

Progress Reports

Progress Reports allow KIPP Columbus to share information about a student's performance within the same buckets - work habits and mastery. Progress Reports will be sent home to families electronically (mail when necessary), once a month.

Promotion and Retention

A student in grades Kindergarten through 5th grade will be considered for retention if 3 or more of these criteria are met:

- Average semester grade in mathematics is far below target
- Average semester grade in ELA is far below target
- Lower than 25th%ile on Star 360 Reading Assessment
- Lower than 25%ile on Star 360 Math Assessment
- Truant for more than ten percent of the required attendance days of the current school year

In 3rd grade, a student cannot be promoted to 4th grade if he/she does not meet one of the following 3 thresholds:

- A scaled score of 683 or higher on the 3rd grade English Language Arts Ohio State Test
- A subcore of 46 or higher on the 3rd grade English Language Arts Ohio State Test
- A RIT score of 194 or higher on the Winter, Spring, or Summer STAR test

When considering retention, other factors will be considered with the family when making a final decision such as whether or not the student has an exceptionality, previous retention, student age, and social emotional development.

6-12 Academic Grading Policy

Grade Scales & Grade Point Average (GPA)

Grade scales include displaying a student's grade in a course by a letter grade, percentage points, and a Grade Point Average. A Grade Point Average is determined by averaging out the grades a student earns in every course for a semester.

High School Summer School/Credit Recovery Grades

Credit recovery is an essential way that KIPP Columbus High School ensures that all students have the ability to learn from mistakes and stay on a pathway towards on time graduation. Oftentimes, credit recovery includes taking a self-directed course through a partner program such as Edmentum.

If a student takes a credit recovery course, the original grade is not replaced; instead, the new grade is added to the transcript. The grade reflected on the transcript for the credit recovery course will be the same as the grade the student earned in the recovery course. (Ex. If a student fails chemistry during the school and passes chemistry in summer school with a B, the F and B will both show-up on this student's transcript).

Calculating GPAs

Grade Point Averages are calculated by dividing the total amount of grade points earned by the total amount of credit hours attempted. A student's GPA may range from 0.0 to a 4.33 (unless also taking Advanced Placement courses, in which the GPA may range from 0.0 to 5.33). It is important to note, that a

0.5 credit course then, would hold less weight in determining a student's GPA than a 1.0 credit course each semester.

Calculating Final Grades

Middle & High School Weights for 2020-2021

Each semester is worth 50% of a student's overall grade for the year. Semester assessments are counted as a mastery grade in each semester.

Due Dates, Deadlines, and Missing Work

Students are expected to submit work on time, frequently with few exceptions made. Teachers will communicate out a due date for each assignment and students are expected to work hard to complete the assignment before that time and ask for help when they need it. If a student misses this due date, they will have up to the remainder of that unit of instruction to submit the missing work. It is important to note that the student is more likely to complete high quality work and be at or above target in each course if they complete assignments to be the best of their ability, and on time.

Exempt Assignments

If a student is absent for more than five school days, teachers may choose to exempt a student from assignments. For this to occur, a student and their family must communicate and partner with the teacher to create a plan that makes the most sense for the student. There should be documentation (doctor's note, etc) that clearly outlines the compelling reason that a student missed that much school. This could include reasons related to coronavirus.

It is important to note that Students will never be exempt for assessments or the knowledge and skills they should be acquiring over the course of the school year.

Assessments & Retakes

Teachers will create opportunities for a student to show improved performance by allowing students to retake assessments on which they score below 70%. Students will be required to attend a minimum of one intervention/reteach session before retaking the assessment. The higher of the two grades will be the one that is entered into the gradebook.

Progress Reports

Progress Reports are where we can share more detail with families. We set Progress Report frequency timelines at every 2 weeks, so that families receive regular and predictable communication. Schools may determine the best vehicle by which to send home progress reports every 2 weeks (physically sending home, emailing, etc).

Report Cards

The grading window for the first semester will close on December 18th with report cards finalized on January 4th and send home to families on January 5th. Tentatively scheduled virtual family conferences will occur from Wednesday, January 5th - Friday, January 7th with families being able to reserve a specific time to meet with their KIPPsters teacher.

Promotion, Retention, and Graduation

Grades 6-8 Retention Considerations: A student will be considered for retention if they are failing multiple courses, performing well behind grade-level expectations on standardized assessments and/or have missed a significant amount of school.

Grades 9-12 Retention Considerations: A student must meet the following minimum criteria in order to keep their standing in their current class cohort:

- To be considered a junior, a student must earn at least 12 credits by the start of their junior year.
- To be considered a senior, a student must earn at least 17 credits by the start of their senior year.
- To graduate from KIPP Columbus High, a student must earn 20 credits in a predetermined distribution of subject areas and fulfill all other requirements set forth by the state of Ohio and KIPP Columbus in order to graduate.

When considering retention, other factors will be considered with the family when making a final decision such as whether or not the student has an exceptionality, previous retention, student age, and social emotional development. still in high school, then promoting the student to the next grade level should be strongly considered.

Student Services Delivery model in the remote setting

- KIPP Columbus is committed to providing exemplary programming and services for students with disabilities throughout remote learning. To the greatest extent possible, remote services will be delivered in line with your KIPPster's Individualized Education Program (IEP) or 504 Plan.

- Remote instruction will be taking place from August 24th to October 2nd. Student services staff will provide specially designed instruction through a variety of remote platforms and services. Below, you will see possible modes of specialized services. We tailor our specialized services to meet the individual needs of the student. Please note that your KIPPster's case manager will be in touch to discuss exactly what your student's services will look like between August 17th and August 24th.

Student Services Delivery Examples

- **Daily/Weekly synchronous (real-time) assistance** from an Intervention Specialist or Paraprofessional during general education lessons
- **Daily/Weekly small group synchronous (real-time) lessons** from an Intervention Specialist or Paraprofessional
- **Daily/Weekly 1:1/small group asynchronous (real-time) assignment support** from an Intervention Specialist or Paraprofessional
- **Weekly/Monthly synchronous (real-time) or Teletherapy Services** from Social Workers, Speech and Language Pathologists, Occupational Therapists, or Physical Therapist

Family Support Services

KIPP Columbus is dedicated to providing families with the support they need to be successful during the remote period. KIPP Columbus provides a wealth of different services for families in need. For additional information regarding any of these services, please contact your KIPPster's school social worker:

Social Workers

School social work services are provided by licensed social workers on campus. School social workers ensure that students are physically, socially, and emotionally ready to learn. Some of the services provided by our social workers include:

- Short-term support (in the classroom whenever possible) to KIPPsters who are having behavior, social, or emotional difficulties
- Behavior and social skills groups
- Developing behavior plans
- Individual counseling
- Community resources and referrals
- Consultation and support for families
- Crisis support for KIPPsters, families, and staff

Families are encouraged to contact their school social worker to learn more about available services and resources. Any sensitive information shared is confidential unless the release of information is required by law or a family gives permission.

KIPP Columbus Emergency Relief Fund

KIPP Columbus is committed to assisting families with extenuating circumstances in accessing support to meet their basic needs (physical safety, shelter, food, utilities,) when other social service support has been exhausted. KIPP Columbus believes in the power of community, and seeks to partner with our families to ensure there are limited barriers to students developing the skills and confidence needed to pursue the paths they choose, lead fulfilling lives, and create a more just world. Support from the KIPP Columbus Emergency Relief Fund is intended to provide short-term assistance, while also working to link families with long-term solutions.

Families experiencing severe hardship will be encouraged to apply for assistance through the KIPP Columbus Emergency Fund, and connected with additional community resources.

Eligibility

The following families or individuals may be eligible to apply for a one time (annually) monetary assistance grant from KIPP Columbus:

- Families with current KIPP Columbus students
- Current KIPP Columbus students that are emancipated minors
- Current KIPP Columbus students or age 18 or older that are responsible for caring for themselves

KIPP Columbus will consider the following factors when determining eligibility:

- Family provides clear documentation of requested need
- Family has exhausted available community supports
- Family is actively engaged with resources to support path to independence
- Urgency of family situation in relation to availability of community supports

Grant Administration Process

Once a family's application has been reviewed, KIPP Columbus staff will communicate the decision with the family, and provide ongoing support.

If an application is denied:

- The Assistant Director of Student Services will connect with the family within 7 days of the application.
- A KIPP Columbus Social Worker will assist the family in securing other means of assistance from applicable community resources.

If an application is approved:

- The Assistant Director of Student Services will connect with the family within 7 days of the application.
- A KIPP Columbus Social Worker will be available to assist the family throughout the process of receiving grant support.

Mandated reporting

- All KIPP Columbus staff members are considered mandated reporters. This means all KIPP Columbus Staff members are obligated to report any suspected abuse or neglect to Franklin County Children's Services as soon as possible.

Additional Policies and Information

Meal Service

Our nutrition program at KIPP Columbus includes FREE breakfast and lunch. These meals are provided in partnership with AVI Food Systems. Meals are available free of charge to KIPP Columbus students. During remote learning, meals are available for pick up each week on Tuesdays from 9:00 AM to 12:00 PM and 4:00 PM to 6:00 PM. These pick-ups include 14 free meals (7 days of breakfast and 7 days of lunch) for every student.

Nutrition Standards

The Healthy Hunger-Free Kids Act (HHFKA), a national school lunch program has been implemented at KIPP Columbus. We have incorporated greater amounts of organic foods, fruits and vegetables, all whole grains, lower levels of calories, etc.

The goal is to increase the overall number of healthy meals students are eating, particularly since school lunches are such an important source of nutrition. In addition to the nutritional meal guidelines, the act also encourages the use of more local and farm fresh produce, school gardens, and healthier snack and drinks choices.

Peanut and Peanut Butter Free School

Due to significant food allergies of some KIPPsters, we are a peanut and peanut butter free school. None of our remote learning meals or products contain peanut butter or peanuts.

Immunization Requirements

Ohio State law requires that all children entering elementary school be immunized against Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis, Polio, Measles, Mumps, Rubella, 2 Hepatitis A, 3 Hepatitis B, and Varicella.

Before a child can be permitted to enter and attend school (subject to the 14-day initial waiver requirement), families must present documentation that their child has received at least one dose of each of the required vaccines and is waiting to receive the subsequent doses at the appropriate time intervals. KIPP Columbus must receive a certificate of immunization no later than **September 30, 2020**.

These requirements can be waived only if a properly signed health or religious exemption is filed with the school. This exemption form can be found in the main office if needed.

Nationwide Children's Hospital Nursing and Clinic

We have three full-time nurses supporting our students every day on campus. These nurses are staffed and still able to be reached for health or wellness questions and concerns during remote learning. Our nurses are fully licensed and work on site through Nationwide Children's Hospital to provide on-site health services. They are available daily to see students who are sick in addition to other scheduled needs like sports physical or prescription refills (if originally issued through Nationwide Children's).

Please contact your school's front office to speak with our nurses about scheduling well visits, sports physicals, and with general questions related to your child's health.
